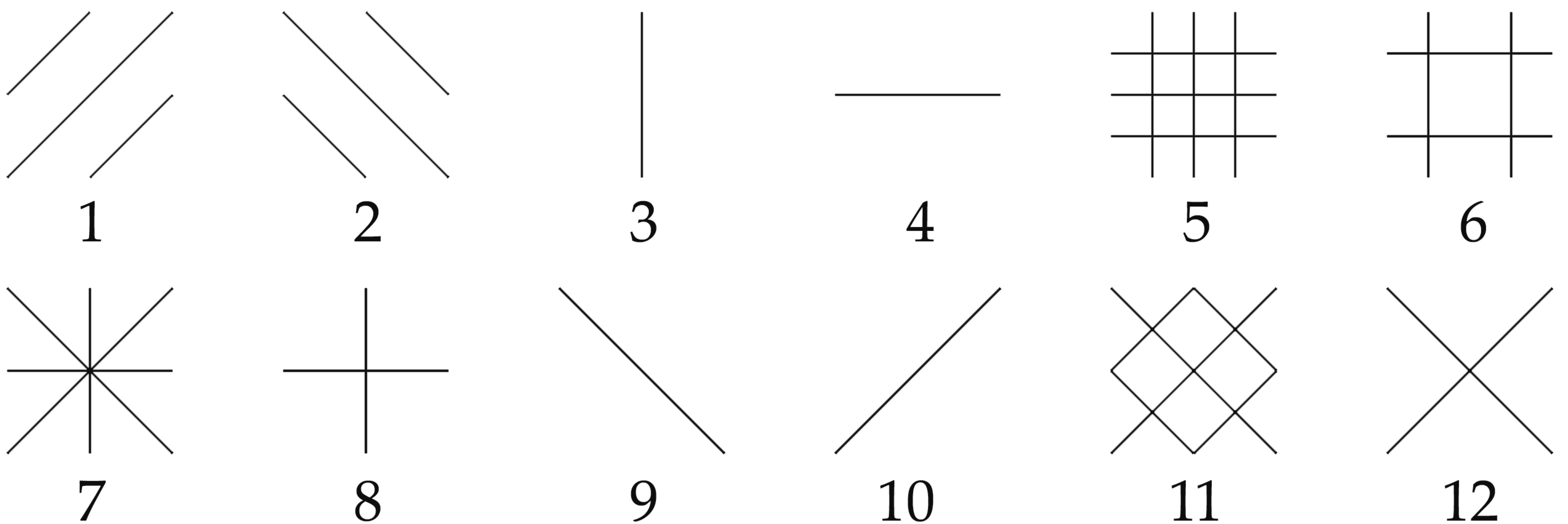


# How to make an Identical Painting.

1 - Draw a 12"x12" square and divide it up into four square quarters.

2 - Roll a 12-sided dice four times. Note down the numbers.

3 - From the small drawings below, transfer the relevant four fragments onto the square you drew in part 1. Start at the top left and work clockwise.



4 - Erase the lines that do not enclose a discrete area.

5 - For each area you have created, roll a 6-sided dice. Note down the resulting numbers in the relevant zones.

6 - You probably have some neighbouring zones that share the same number. If so, erase the line that divides them.

7 - Colour in each zone according to the following scheme:

1=red / 2=orange / 3=yellow / 4=green / 5=blue / 6=purple

Obviously you could come up with your own fragments, picture shape and colour scheme to create your own suite of identical paintings. This is just my take on it.

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
